E-learning Course Options



E-Course: Self-paced, fully virtual course with interactive content, completed by the learner at their own pace. Interactive content may include: resource downloads, training videos, interactive case scenarios and virtual activities, discussion boards, and quizzes.

Foundational Practice Training

Foundational courses provide an introductory-level understanding of domestic violence-informed practice and the Safe & Together Model concepts and practice skills.



Safe & Together Model Overview

Description: This training provides participants with an introduction to, and overview of, the Safe & Together Model. The course provides participants with information about creating a domestic violence-informed child welfare system, the principles and components of the Safe & Together Model and information about the framework behind competency-building in child welfare around domestic violence.

Safe & Together: An Introduction to the Model

Description: This course provides an introduction to the internationally recognized Safe & Together™ Model, a set of concepts, tools, and practices to improve how agencies, communities, and individuals respond to domestic violence when children are involved. The first half of the course will introduce you to the ideas and concepts behind the Model. You'll learn about gaps and challenges related to domestic violence cases involving children, the importance of applying a perpetrator pattern-based approach, and how partnerships with adult survivors are critical to domestic violence-informed practice. You will also learn how to improve assessment addressing perpetration as a parenting choice and giving mothers full credit for their protective efforts. In the second half of the course you will be introduced to the practice principles and critical components of the Model and how they can help make a difference in case practice.

Multiple Pathways to Harm: A Comprehensive Assessment Framework

Description: This course provides an introduction to the Safe & Together Model's "Multiple Pathways to Harm" assessment and critical thinking framework. In this course you will learn how to apply a comprehensive assessment framework as you explore the impact of the domestic violence perpetrator's behaviors on child and family functioning. Learning this approach will help you maintain high standards for men as parents, better engage men from diverse backgrounds and create partnerships with adult survivors. The Multiple Pathways to Harm framework will help you think through and document adult survivors' efforts to promote their children's safety and well-being to develop more effective plans and recommendations for children and families.

Working with Men as Parents: Fathers' Parenting Choices Matter

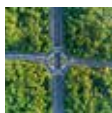
Description: If we want to work with families, we cannot just work with women and children. We need to be able to work with men. This is important for all families, but may be even more important for families from poor and historically oppressed communities. To do this in domestic violence-informed way, we need to approach fathers with high expectations for them as parents, a willingness to learn new approaches and practices, and an understanding of male parental development and how men's choices and behaviors impact child and family functioning. It involves understanding how to use this information to engage men and to develop meaningful child and family-focused interventions, as well as integrating these understandings into our work with women and children. Throughout this course we will highlight specific connections to the Safe and Together Model Principles, Critical Components, Multiple Pathways to Harm and Practice Tools.

Intersections: When Domestic Violence Perpetration, Substance Abuse, and Mental Health Meet

Description: Many families impacted by domestic violence perpetrators' behaviors have multiple, complex, intersecting issues. In the past, we might have referred to these as co-occurring issues, but the language of co-occurrence often doesn't provide us with a sense of how these issues interact. Using an intersections framework versus a co-occurrence framework, we increase perpetrator accountability and improve our ability to assess the family and our ability to partner with adult survivors. This course will provide guidance on how to understand the connections, or intersections, and make them work for us in our practice. This course is primarily focused on the adult perpetrator and survivor.

COMING SOON! Partnering with Adult Survivors

Description: Partnering with adult survivors around the safety and well-being of their children is a central focus of domestic violence-informed practice. Domestic violence survivors and helping professionals share the common goals for the abuse to stop and for the children to thrive. In this course, we describe a step by step process for partnering with adult survivors when children are involved. This method is useful for a wide variety of professionals and can even inform the work of attorneys, evaluators and others who are involved in assessments of families. This training is designed to build upon prior Safe & Together Model CORE training concepts and to provide a skills-oriented foundation for applying CORE concepts to partnering practice with adult survivors.

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Comprehensive Practice Training

Comprehensive courses are designed to promote skill-building and application of key concepts to practice.




Safe & Together Model: Virtual CORE Training

Description: This training is designed to provide a skills-oriented foundation for domestic violence-informed practice and create opportunities for professional behavior change. The course provides training focused on the following foundational practice areas: assessment, interviewing, documentation and case planning.

CORE Training explores the importance of:

- Identifying the impact of domestic violence on children and family functioning.
- Fact-based assessment of the perpetrators' behavior patterns.
- Partnering with adult survivors of domestic violence.
- Intervening with perpetrators.
- How domestic violence intersects with other issues like substance abuse and mental health.
- How intersectionalities like race, immigration status or a chronic illness impact the perpetrator's pattern of behavior and the vulnerability of the survivor and the children.

Participants of the CORE Training will learn to use practice tools that can be implemented right away to improve assessment of risk, impact on children, survivor protective efforts and essential case decisions. Participants are encouraged to apply the concepts to their own current or past cases and explore how the Safe & Together Model could be implemented in their personal practice and in their agency or system.

Description: Domestic violence is one of the most challenging case issues facing child welfare and other family service agencies. Handling it well requires skills, confidence and knowledge. What Faith Leaders Need to Know About Domestic Violence

Description: Faith leaders can play a vital role in the safety, well-being, and nurturance of adult and child victims, but research shows that many victims are hesitant to speak to pastors and other religious leaders about abuse, with some reporting that disclosure to a faith leader did not result in assistance, but in prolonged trauma and even danger. Presented in partnership with the Hartford Seminary, David Mandel and Ruth Stearns Mandel of the Safe and Together Institute speak on how faith leaders can best be allies to those living with domestic violence, coercive control, and child abuse by partnering with victims and survivors and holding those who choose to abuse accountable for their behaviors and how those behaviors harm their families. Together they walk through principles and strategies for best practice, how to identify danger and how to engage victims in a positive and non-victim-blaming way; paving the way for partnership, accountability, increased safety, healing, and nurturance.

COMING SOON! Strength Through Adversity: Identifying Survivors' Parenting Strengths During Social Distancing

Description: While social distancing measures are in place, society is placing huge additional burdens on families to keep children physically and emotionally well, safe, sane, clean, educated and entertained. These tasks are disproportionately placed on mothers and are even more challenging to accomplish in the context of changing perpetrator behavior patterns. It is critical that we identify and validate how hard survivors are working to adapt in order to keep their children safe during this crisis and that we learn how to support them in their efforts. At a time when agency contact with children has been severely reduced, survivors may be our only allies in relation to child safety. Join Heidi Rankin, Associate Director at the Safe & Together Institute as she draws on case examples gathered from workers during the pandemic to highlight how we can identify and validate the parenting strengths of domestic violence survivors during social distancing.

Our Training Certification Program has gone virtual! The training components of the Trainer Certification Program are now accessible online to those organizations that have applied and been accepted into our Trainer Certification Program. This includes:



Virtual Train the Trainer

Description: This 7-day Train the Trainer is one component of the larger Safe & Together™ Model Trainer Certification Program and is designed to provide a skills-oriented foundation for training on the following curricula: Safe & Together™ Model CORE Training, 1-day Overview, and the 1-hour Briefing. Train the Trainer is focused on moving trainer candidates toward mastery in three main competencies:

- Knowledge, skills and attitudes related to the Continuum of Domestic Violence-informed Practice;
- Knowledge, skills and attitudes related to the Safe & Together™ Model; and
- Knowledge, skills and attitudes related to the CORE Training manual and related training activities.

Supervisor Training Credential

Description: In order to effectively support domestic violence-informed practice in a child protection system, supervisors and managers must have an understanding of domestic violence and its impact on families as well as on those they supervise. This e-course reviews the foundational principles and components of the Safe & Together™ Model through the lens of the supervisory role. The course introduces a coaching framework for supervision in order to best assess and support workers' skill development, address workers' safety concerns that impact practice, and provide domestic violence-informed case guidance and decision-making. This course is one part of the larger Safe & Together™ Trainer Certification Program. It provides a skills-oriented foundation for training the Safe and Together™ Supervisors Training.

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Case Study: Training and transformation in the time of COVID

The Safe & Together Institute's Trainer Certification Program is the main engine of our efforts to transform systems across the globe. When the pandemic struck, in-person training came to a halt for every Partner Agency in every region. In response, our Resource Development Team worked diligently to make it possible for existing Partner Agencies and Certified Trainers to continue delivering domestic violence-informed training at a time when fears about survivors' increased vulnerability and isolation was escalating. The Institute also took immediate steps to ensure that the new 2020 Train the Trainer Certification Process could occur remotely.

In a few short months, our team was able to accomplish the following:

- Offer a variety of modalities to deliver the CORE and Overview training including: e-course, virtual training and a blended model that combined both e-course and virtual training sessions.
- Move the Train the Trainer from in-person to online for all three regions. 2020's Certified Trainer cohort will be our largest ever, increasing our numbers by 50%.
- Add our first online credential course which enables our Certified Trainers to offer our Supervisor and Manager training content across the globe at a lower cost.

By June 2020, after months of no training, our Partner Agencies were offering the same number of training, online, as they were delivering in-person before the pandemic struck.
