


Safe & Together™ Model Conference 2018 Evaluation Results


In October 2018, the Annual Safe & Together™ Model Conference on Domestic Violence and Children was held in San Antonio, Texas. Attendees were sent a post-conference evaluation after the conference using Survey Monkey®. Attendees were asked to rate the conference overall and give feedback, as well as provide individual feedback to sessions they attended. A total number of 216 attendees completed the conference evaluation. Over 20% of these conference attendees had previously attended a Safe & Together training. Results from the evaluation and individual session feedback is highlighted in this report.
